6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The college follows the Calcutta University curriculum, so there is little scope of internal curriculum change.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- a) Three Assistant Professors in substantive posts in different departments have been recruited during this academic session.
- b) The college has also filled up the post of Principal.
- c) Workshop for students appearing for competitive examination has been conducted.
- d) The construction of Smart Classroom is almost finished.
- e) Modernization of college library is in process.
- f) Results of examinations at different stages are analyzed and steps are taken

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

As per Calcutta University guidelines, students appear for Mid-Team and Test Examinations. Students also appear for regular tutorials and class test. Scope for review of University results is available.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The establishment of a more formal Research Cell, named Baruipur College Research Cell, on campus is being planned. Research and Publication Code of Ethics have been circulated among teachers and students and uploaded in the college website. The faculty members also engage in research activities and many of their articles are published. The students are also encouraged to

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

A number of book shelves, racks, channel partition with glass have been purchased through Gyandhara Project initiated by P.C. Chandra Group, Kolkata. The library is partially digitalized and effort to digitise significant number of library books is in process. Koha software is being used for library management. Overall infrastructure of the library is also being enhanced.

The college could not conduct specific industry interaction/ collaboration; however, the college conducted a one-day workshop in collaboration with Future Institute of Engineering and Management.

- c) The entire process of admission is done through on-line process.

(1) Best Practices of the Institution (2016-17)

Title of the Practice: Installation of CCTV on campus for enhanced safety and security of the college

Goal: To enhance safety and security of the college through the installation of CCTV on campus.

The Context: Since the college is located in a remote, rural area the security and safety within college campus is always a pressing concern. The back section of the college was difficult to monitor on a regular basis and security of the college at night was also a serious concern.

The Practice: The entire campus was covered under CCTV surveillance. 16 CCTV cameras of various capacities were installed at strategic locations to increase safety, security and transparency within college campus. The recording machine continuously records the video feeds from different cameras and are archived for future reference. The security of the college during late at night is also assured through CCTV surveillance.

Evidence of Success: Presently, the campus can be monitored centrally through the LCD screen at the Principal's chamber. CCTV footage has so far helped at various cases including unlawful pasting of posters on college wall and littering at college premises.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required: The security and safety within college campus is of utmost importance. However, to monitor the entire campus is impossible without CCTV surveillance. Particularly, the back side of the college was relatively outside of the visible zone and was in need of regular monitoring. Hence, the college authority decided to install 16 CCTV cameras at different locations on campus and the purchase sub-committee decided to install Hikvision cameras and digital recorder which would increase the safety and security on campus.

Title of the Practice: Solar powered renewable energy use in college campus.

Goal: To set up eco-friendly solar power grid in the college and to utilize renewable energy for

environment friendly energy consumption on campus.

The Context: The electricity consumption in college campus is an increasing financial concern as well as an environmental issue. The solar powered renewable energy may provide an efficient alternative to environmentally hazardous fossil-fuel energy and would also cut down the rising

electricity expenditures on campus.

The Practice: The college has installed solar panel as an eco-friendly source of power. The project comprises of roof top grid connected to solar PV system and is funded by Government of

West Bengal and Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, Government of India. The capacity of

the solar panel is 10 KWP. Approximately, 30% of the total electricity consumption of the

college will be provided by the system.

Evidence of Success: Presently, the entire solar grid has been installed on the roof of the college

campus and the system is also connected with the PV system. Once fully functional the system

will provide about 30% of the total electricity as renewable energy on campus.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required: The college has to pay a hefty amount as

electricity bill every month. Hence, alternative source of electricity is necessary to reduce monthly electric consumption and also to endorse eco-friendly renewable energy on campus.

With the help of the Government of West Bengal the 10 KWP solar panel will provide

significant amount of renewable energy on campus.
